

LMC Committee January 2022- Update for practices

Торіс	Update
New Committee	 This was the first committee meeting with our new members following the recent LMC election. The LMC were happy to welcome some new faces as well as those who have been committee members before. The Committee also elected a new Committee Chair, Dr Stephen Savory, east Lincolnshire GP, and agreed that Dr Mark Protheroe, west Lincolnshire GP, will remain in the Vice Chair post.
NHS Resolution	 Ellen Nicholson and Dr Anwar Khan spoke about NHS Resolution, a service that has been managing general practice indemnity on behalf of the Department of health since 2019. There are four parts to NHS Resolution: Claims Management Practitioner Performance Advice: Helping doctors in difficulties Primary Care Appeals: Providing fair and impartial dispute resolution service. Safety and Learning: Helping members to better understand their risk profiles and providing support to them.
General Practice Community Pharmacy Consultation Service (GP CPCS)	 Emily Topham (ET)and Dr Ola Adegbite (OA) spoke to the Committee about the GP CPCS, This service provides patients with the option of having a face-to-face appointment or remote consultation with a pharmacist. Two main funding streams attached to the GP CPCS service, 'Investment and Impact Fund' (indicators expected to resume in April 22) and 'Winter Access Fund' (to access WAF funding, practices need to have signed up and made their first referral by 31st January 22). Both schemes focus on increasing patient access to clinicians. OA provided the Committee with feedback about his experience using the service. Whilst there are some challenges, overall, the experience has been very positive for both patients and practice. So far 13 practices in Lincolnshire have signed up. Transitional Care Beds	 The LMC Committee provided Sarah-Jane Mills (SJM) with feedback regarding transitional care beds. Feedback included: identifying transitional care patient and issues with registering these patients and accessing records. additional resourcing poor quality of discharge summaries and ReSPECT forms particularly patients going into safe environments such as residential care homes incorrect/ incomplete medication or no medication provided on discharge.
Pilgrim hospital service	 LMC reviewed a draft letter regarding departments and services being moved away from Pilgrim Hospital which when approved will be sent to local Members of Parliament.

CQC	 All GP and urgent care inspections are suspended until further notice. The exception is where there is significant risk that may need to serious harm or death. All Lincolnshire inspectors, except one part time inspector, are temporarily leaving the PMS team to go and carry out inspections of adult social care.
Pharmacy	 GP Community Pharmacy Consultation Scheme GPCPCS has had poor uptake across Lincolnshire. GPCPCS team attended LMC see above.
Primary/secondary care interface	 Contact Compliance Week Flow charts shared with hospitals and generally well accepted. Please share with clinical teams in practices and specialists if they breach contract. Med flow chart.pptx Investigations flow chart.pptx C2C referals guideline.pptx LPFT Still working on standard referral letter and standard letter from psychiatrists Internal LPFT interface issues also being worked through. LCHS Blood tests Still working through routes for community teams to have access to their own requested tests, these should not be coming to practices Trainee sessions at UTCs Still a shortage of UTC training slots. LCHS deny this but trainees find it next to impossible to book slots. A2A Practices should not need to complete A2A forms for non-injectable items but are still being asked to do this. Practices can use SystmOne template for A2A instead of paper form. Working with LCHS to get similar process for EMIS practices. Podiatry New podiatry triage process in place so all referrals go via eRS to the EACH and then triaged to the appropriate specialty, including community surgical scheme. This process will apply to patient self-referrals too. Private Providers BMI very responsive to changing referral and interface Ramsay not responsive so still issues with Boston West and Fitzwilliam. CCG contracts department looking into the issues and whether contractual action is required.
Councils	 Coroner/Medical examiner Medical examiners will be scrutinising deaths in the community and have asked for practices to volunteer to be the first practices for this to happen. Health Checks Health checks not paused, or payment protected. LA awaiting National steer regarding this.

Trainees	 Training shifts in UTC/OOH GP trainees are experiencing difficulties getting sessions at the urgent treatment centres to do out of hours. There is a concern that they will not fulfil the criteria for the work-based assessment. Visas for GPTs This is a hot-topic at NHSEI so hopefully will see more support for GP trainees who require visa at CCT.
LMC Practice Calls/ Visits	 LMC continues to make courtesy calls to practices offer support and gather feedback. Many practices have not been available to talk due to pressures in practice however the LMC continues to reach out. FAQs & weekly updates continue to be well received and feedback about the LMC is generally very positive. LMC are planning to restart practice visits soon.
