This has not been helped by the arson attack at Lincoln County Hospital following which the DEXA has been condemned along with one of the CT scanners and MRI cells. LMC will go live with GPAS across the county at the beginning of May. This will build a picture of how general practice is doing and provide anonymous evidence to the CCG.</li> </ul>

CQC	Routine CQC inspections re-started on 1 April 2022. Initially the focus will be around practices deemed as high risk & new providers, (CQC band 3).
	<ul> <li>CQC will also be randomly inspecting a percentage of practices (in CQC band 1) to sample those practices not considered at risk. These inspections will be done with two weeks' notice.</li> </ul>
	Annual CQC phone calls will continue. Previously, these were done by local inspectors however they will now be carried out by a central team and the information will be passed to the local team to decide whether to inspect.

The Cameron Fund	<ul> <li>The Cameron Fund is a charity that supports GPs and their families facing financial difficulties by providing interest free loans and grants.</li> <li>Approximately one Lincolnshire GP is referred to the Cameron Fund charity every 6 months.</li> <li>The Committee has made a donation as the Lincolnshire LMC had not contributed in recent years.</li> </ul>

GPC Update	Provided by our GPC representative, Dr Kieran Sharrock; representing Lincolnshire, East Yorkshire and Humberside GPs at the GPC.  The Safety Campaign: This is a campaign that looks at safe working. If your GPs are seeing more than thirty patients a day, it is likely they are making bad decisions and prescribing inappropriate medications. The safety campaign is running alongside the Rebuild GP Campaign. According to the GPC, based on data regarding how many times a patient record is opened compared to the GPAD data, GPs are doing 70% more decision making work than just mapped appointments. This campaign looks at three points:  ARRS staff, although the funding covers the ARRS staff member's wage, it does not pay for the national insurance contribution or the GPs time supervising the staff member and it does not pay for the Practice or HR Managers' time.  Enhanced health in care homes: Does this actually prevent hospital admissions or is it more work than the benefit to the practice?  Extended access: Currently this is being delivered mostly by practices who receive seven pounds forty-six funding for providing the service. In October it will be delivered by PCNs and it is likely to be more restrictive and more work. GPC recommends that practices seriously consider whether the PCN DES is beneficial to them. If practices say to the LMC that they are considering resigning from the PCN DES then this can be fed back to NHS England and that may be enough to instigate some flexibility regarding how practices use ARRS funding and how to offer appointments.  The committee discussed how practices can work together to instigate change and proposed meeting with the CCG to discuss safe working. GPAD appointment mapping	Committee discussed GPAD in relation to what should be recorded and how to reflect the real workload. LMC agreed to develop more training for practices focussing on what should be recorded and how, as well as how to interpret the data.
