

LMC Committee May 2022- Update for practices

Lincolnshire LMC representative members meet with the secretariate monthly to obtain updates on progress from the previous month, hear from invited guest speakers, discuss relevant events, issues, and hot topics, and make decisions regarding future actions.

The table below is intended to inform you about the main points provided to the LMC Committee during the last meeting.

Topic	Update
Speaker: Dr Tom Davis: Senior Clinical Advisor to the Lincolnshire Health and Care Collaborative	 Dr Tom Davis, (TD), is part of the National Intensive support Team. TD's role, focussing on Recovery Support, (the new special measures), is to work with clinical and operational executives to provide support with the aim of increasing capacity and capability at a systems level. TD's work will be keeping within the system improvement plan which focusses on; flow, discharge, care closer to home, musculoskeletal and pharmacy. The support provided will be at a systems and grass roots level and TD is currently working to identify what the challenges are within the system. TD recognised the need for general practice to have a louder voice at the collaborative table.

Flu 2022	 NHS England and NHS Improvement has published <u>guidance</u> about reimbursable vaccines and eligible cohorts for the 2022/23 flu vaccination programme. 2022/23 flu programme likely to be combined. The Screening and Immunisation Team will be linking with Rebecca Neno. There will be a primary school programme for flu vaccines but not for secondary school.
STP/ CCG	 ICS development Committee were informed of the three-stage process to recruit the GP representative on the ICB: Each eligible organisation will get one vote and that vote will need to be seconded by another eligible organisation. The vote can be for a GP, pharmacist, optometrist, or dentist within the MSP. A list of nominees will be sent to all contract holders and will require fifty percent approval to move to the next stage. RB clarified that contract must approve the whole list or reject the whole list even if the rejection is just for one nominated person. RB explained that contract holders must respond within ten days and if they do not respond then that non-response will be counted as approval. A panel of five will be convened by John Turner to assess the suitability of nominees. If no suitable nominee is identified, then the process will revert to stage one. Lincolnshire LMC have also asked to sit on the recruiting panel. Protected Learning Time Committee asked the LMC secretariate to follow up the county wide PLT with the CCG as there have been no recent updates.



Planned care

- Virtual consultations discussed at Planned Care and Diagnostic Cell. Issues raised by multiple GPs about the impact this has on patients and practices. Processes for prescriptions and tests to be organised now being looked into.
- CCG and ULHT working on current contracting round- LMC suggested having EPS as a contractual requirement.
- Various specialties have particularly long waiting lists: colorectal, dermatology, ENT, and neurology. Recovery plans in place.
- Recent Fire at LCH resulting in increased waiting times. DEXA condemned
- Cardio, neuro, ENT waiting list focussed reduction aim.

Practice resilience

- Practice Support Network:
 - First meeting taking place on 22nd June and will be focussing on Enhanced Services
 - On-site support also available
- OPEL/GPAS
 - GPAS rolled out countywide beginning of May 22. Over 50% practices are completing returns and the number is increasing each week.
 - The current GPAS is Amber 2 / Opel 3.
 - LMC encourages all practices to participate.
- Recruitment.
- LMC recruitment event taking place on the evening of Wednesday 29th June in Sleaford. Open to GPs & GP trainees looking for employment in Lincolnshire. The event will include information about GP fellowship opportunities, visa sponsorship and funding as well as time for practices to network with candidates.

Enhanced services/DCAs

- New DOAC ES specifications produced
- Various other ES being reviewed this and next quarter
- Spirometry Pathway:
 - This is a new spirometry diagnostic service which will be delivered over a PCN footprint for economy of scale, primarily for asthma and COPD.
 - The main differences for practices who are already providing spirometry are things like FeNO and onward referrals.
 - Originally spirometry was meant to be included in extended access however it has now been removed.
 - Funding is likely to be per capita and there is some flexibility to allow practices/
 PCNs to work together to ensure geographic coverage.
 - Committee raised the need to fund associated costs such as management and admin, staff training & ARTP accreditation, facilities, and equipment.
- Safeguarding Specification:
 - Payments for reports have been confirmed at £50 for a standard report and £100 for a complex report
 - Practices must be signed up to enhanced services for these payments to be made
 - If less than 5 days' notice has been given for the child protection conference, then the practice will not be expected to have completed the report before the conference takes place.

	Community colleagues have requested back door numbers from practices so that they do not have to go through switchboards. Committee discussed a lack of communication from community colleagues and agreed that direct numbers to community nurses should also be shared with GPs so that GPs do not have to use the 0300 numbers. LMC secretariate will be passing this feedback to community leads.
Councils	 Coroner: Covid death certification regulations end on 31st March 2022. However new regulations come into force which allow death certification if deceased seen by a medical practitioner in the 28 days preceding death. LMC unsure whether cremation regulations also amended but will update practices when this is understood. CME roll our hampered by IT/Governance issues. Advert released for further recruitment.
Child protection	 Safeguarding specification discussed above Guidance will be coming out regarding safeguarding and Ask My GP. There have been instances where child protection enquiries have been made through Ask My GP and the parent has gained access to the enquiry.
Medical School	Medical Student GP-focussed projects: Committee asked to provide topics for projects that might be useful.
