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ONWARD REFERRAL FROM EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS

Emergency Departments do not have the ability to safely make or follow-up onward referrals.

It has been agreed though that patients seen in ULHT EDs who require urgent assessment, but do not require admission, will be referred on by the ED clinician. This ensures that patients do not have delayed onward referral. This applies to patients who require 2WW suspected cancer referral, Rapid Access Chest Pain Clinic referral, and stroke or TIA referral.

Patients who have been seen and assessed by a specialist team in ED and require their follow up or onward referral, the specialist team should arrange this. This includes further assessment by cardiac team when seen by a cardiac specialist nurse, or onward referral for spinal assessment when the patient has been seen by orthopaedics.

If the patient may require further assessment but this is not urgent, and the patient has not been seen by a specialist team, the ED clinician will ask for the GP to review the patient to agree further management options, including possible onward referral. The ED team will ask the patient to contact their GP practice to arrange a discussion regarding ongoing management.

If you receive letters from ED and you believe that onward referral should have been made by the ED team, please put the patient's care first and ensure that they have the appropriate onward referral. Once this has been arranged please send an anonymised copy of the correspondence to the LMC and we will be able to liaise with the ED clinical lead to improve the referral pathways.

SOP FOR PRACTICES FROM 19TH JULY 2021

<u>Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for practices from 19th</u> July 2021

On 19th July 2021 NHSEI wrote to practices explaining their expectations of practices from 19th July onwards. In summary this letter says

- Infection Prevention and Control- practices should continue to follow PHE guidance, including maintaining social distancing and face covering deployment
- Service delivery- practices should offer a blended approach of face-to-face and remote consultation with digital triage
- Suspended services- most services provided by practices are reinstated but:
 - Friends and Family Test remains suspended
 - -Consent requirement for eRD remains suspended
 - -111 appointment requirement remains at one slot per 500 patients per day (locally reduced to 1:1000)
 - -DSQS DRUM can be completed remotely

Previous SOP "General practice in the context of coronavirus" no longer applies.

INTRODUCTION OF WEBV FOR RADIOLOGY REQUESTS

Lincolnshire CCG will soon be introducing a new software application for GP practices to request radiology tests. Practices need to sign up all their clinicians to be able to use this software application.

This software application, WebV, is currently used by both ULHT and NLAG to request radiology tests, blood tests, and record physiological readings when patients are in hospital.

Further details will follow regarding timeframes for the switch to this new system. The CCG will also provide guidance how to use WebV.

NATIONAL WORKFORCE REPORTING SERIVCE

What do I need to do before the first collection on 31st July?

The aim of this new service is to make the task as simple and efficient as possible to help minimise the burden placed upon practices and primary care networks (PCNs). Before the first collection on 31st July, practices will need to:

1) Check that the person responsible for filling in the NWRS has registered for the new service via the <u>Strategic Data</u> <u>Collection Service (SDCS)</u>. If you are already registered, you do not need to register again but you will need to <u>sign</u> <u>in</u> before 31st July to check that your login details are still valid.

2) Make sure you organisation/s information is correct.

VACCINES AND UNDOCUMENTED MIGRANTS

Recent research conducted by the Bureau of Investigative Journalism about access to Covid vaccines for those who are not registered with a GP practice, showed that many practices refuse to register patients who cannot provide an address, proof of ID, or immigration status. GP surgeries are required to register all patients, (if their list is open to new patients).

There is a useful resource called the Safe Surgeries toolkit which was developed by Doctors of the World, (DOTW) which aims to help practices understand all the relevant guidance and sets out recommendations that practices can adopt to reassure patients that they will not be turned away and that the practice is inclusive.

FREE training is available to clinical and non-clinical staff that aims to improve awareness and enables staff to better advocate for their patients.
