

LMC Committee October 2022- Update for practices

Lincolnshire LMC representative members meet with the secretariate monthly to obtain updates on progress from the previous month, hear from invited guest speakers, discuss relevant events, issues, and hot topics, and make decisions regarding future actions.

The table below is intended to inform you about the main points provided to the LMC Committee during the last meeting.

STP/ CCG	 Flu Committee reminded if a practices staff are patients at the practice and are a healthcare worker, the practice can claim. If your staff are not patients but are TR the practice cannot claim
	 ICS Development Winter planning discussions have started. There is a steering group, discussing some practices opening on Bank Holidays, there is talk about putting in place anticipatory care. Committee discussed whether it would be possible to staff with an already stretched and tired workforce. There were also comments also about priorities focussing on supporting the trusts rather than the core work
	 Protected Learning Time An update was provided to the Committee – there is not going to be any 'Protected' Leaning Time for Lincolnshire practices however the Lincolnshire Training Hub are implementing face to face 'Learning Time' sessions for practices. Committee continue to feel very strongly that there is a real need for protected time and by not protecting this time there will not be as much uptake as it will not be possible to release GPs due to staff shortages. Lincolnshire LMC have completed some scoping work to see what other areas in the country have protected learning time. LMC are sharing the list of areas with the ICB.
	 Patient Access To Records Committee discussed the likeliness of this being delayed again. If this is not delayed; the BMA are planning to put out some advice about how to object and decline based on patient mental health and safety concerns.
	 <u>It/Digital:</u> Local Admin Rights This has been discussed at length. Feedback from Practices provided to AGEM, awaiting outcome of further discussions from Steve Pitwell. WebV Migration There are four practices across the county involved in the pilot. Committee provided some feedback and have asked for WebV to be responsive to smart cards so that staff don't have to contend with multiple logins if they have more than one role. Other Progress is being made for EMIS Practices to have their notes collected and digitised.



	 Discussions about future Intranets. Likely outcome is to use Agilio TeamNet. Further discussions needed as a Roadmap of development and a commitment from Agilio for its continued support. From 7 October 2022, users will not be able to access the NHS e-Referral Service (e-RS) using Internet Explorer. This includes Edge in Internet Explorer mode (sometimes known as 'Compatibility Mode'). From 1 November 2022, patients must be allowed digital access to view their prospective (future) medical record, including free text and documents. Following a successful trial of the 'Register with a GP surgery service' NHS Digital are offering additional practices in England the opportunity to provide online registration to their patients to make registration more accessible to the public
	Shared Care Specifications
	 Committee reviewed the new specifications. Main points and concerns raised were: an agreement does not provide support, it can be difficult to get advice. complex patients coming from outside Lincolnshire and their drugs not being shared care drugs
	 Complexity of claiming and the searches not being available on Ardens searches Not specifying that the ADHD360 HCP must be a qualified medical professional Who should be signing shared care requests? Committee agreed that it should be each individual practice to decide based on the role, skills, and experience of each clinician.
	FCC Specification
	<u>ECG Specification</u> Committee reviewed the ECG specification. Committee discussed the need to sometimes submit referrals without an ECG. All agreed that referrals should not be rejected on the basis that the patient has not had an ECG.
	Committee also discussed whether there was a need for as many mandated yearly updates when the GP is using their skills on a daily basis.
	Lincolnshire Provider Review (LPR)
	Committee viewed and discussed LPR Concern was raised by members about LMC involvement and access to discussions. The Committee agreed that Lincolnshire LMC is the statutory representative body and official voice for general practices in Lincolnshire so the LMC should have a statutory role in the consultation. Committee also discussed the ever increasing workload.

	• Medical Examining Officers (MEOs) will summarise the case from the time leading up
	to the death. The Medical Examiner will then go through the summary and then
	either the MEO or ME will speak with family members directly.
	• From 1st April 2023, all deaths will have to be reported to the ME electronically.
	Currently there are several Lincolnshire GP practices trialling the service.
	 Committee agreed this is a good opportunity to get used to the new process before it becomes mandatory.
	 There are three full time equivalents. Averaging six cases per four-hour session.
	 Committee raised communication and process concerns that need to be ironed out
	before 1 st April.
