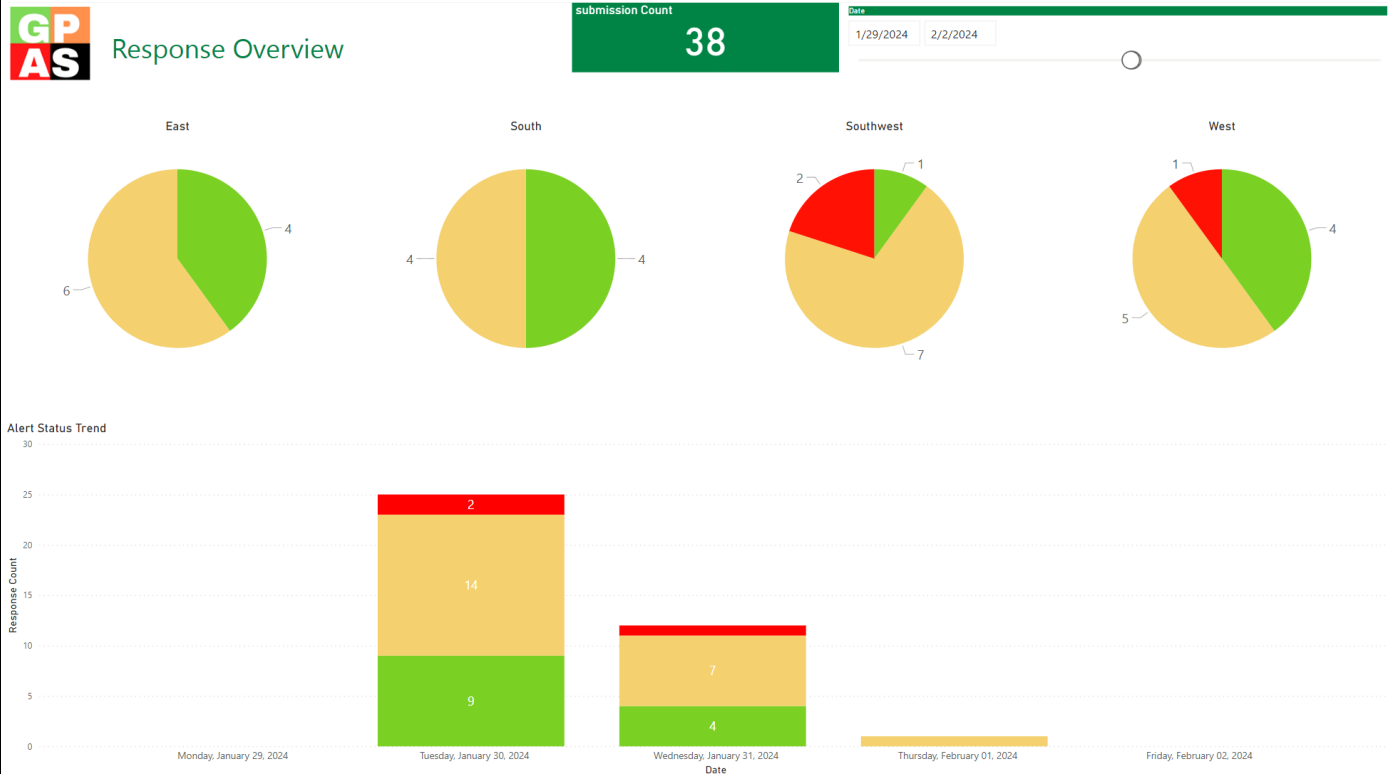

### GPAS – COMMENT / ANALYSIS



The county wide assessment this week is **AMBER / OPEL 3** with **58%** of reporting practices assessed as **AMBER**, **8%** reporting as **RED**, **0%** as **BLACK** covering a total patient population of **285,040**. **GREEN** assessments account for **34%**.

In addition to the standard report attached, we have received the following information affecting General practices:

#### Other comments:

- Annual leave affecting capacity.
- Can't recruit ANP, investing heavily in locums to support our roll out of a new triage model.
- Staff sickness, appointments had to be rearranged adding pressure to other days.
- High level of DNAs, all were pre-booked.
- Babies and young children with coughs and colds and patients with anxiety and depression.
- Appointments to express dissatisfaction with secondary care wait times - condition worsening.
- Extreme demand over and above expected levels.
